Is there a <b>conclusion</b> that summarizes the research question, method & findings, and suggests future research directions?	<ul> <li>The conclusion:</li> <li>summarizes the research question, methods, and findings in enough detail to remind the reader of what the student has done in the paper.</li> <li>suggests directions for future research that flow logically from the findings of the paper.</li> <li>logically and compellingly draws the paper to a close.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>summarizes the research question, methods, and findings, but without adequate detail.</li> <li>suggests directions for future research, but they might be vague or lack clarity.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>is missing a summary of one or two of the research question, methods, and findings.</li> <li>some suggestions for future research are tangential to the analysis in the paper rather than building on what has been done.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>fails to summarize the research question, methods and findings.</li> <li>fails to provide suggestions for future research.</li> <li>OR there is no conclusion.</li> </ul>

## Questions to Ask Before You Fill in the Criteria:

- Are these components of the paper additive and being evaluated separately (assign points) or are these components part of a holistic idea of what makes a successful paper (assign letter grades)?
- Is each criterion structured similarly to the other criteria?
- Are there any skills being assessed which are not taught in the class or in their curriculum thus far? If so, should I write them more explicitly for students (development) or should I remove them (mastery)?
